Performance Instructions:


The whole performance should feel very improvisatory. Each section should last about 20 seconds, but can vary given the improvisatory nature. General shaping of gestures, dynamics, and climaxes should be improvised in response to the electronics. In particular, section C should try to correspond with a crescendo and/or rise in pitch in the electronics, climaxing at the same time. Section D should begin while the electronics are loud, overtaking the guitar's dynamics (hopefully directly following the simultaneous crescendi in section C) so that the very quiet playing is not heard at first, but is revealed once the electronics calm down a bit. Section E should feel like a cathartic coda.
